What an exciting start to the year as we welcome new faces to Foxes Class! The autumn term is always a busy, yet exciting one with lots of activities planned, whilst watching friendships grow and blossom! It has been a lovely few days allowing the children to explore the classroom and getting to know each of them. I am very excited for the year ahead and look forward to seeing the children progress!



To begin the year, our first topic is 'Local Studies'. This is a great topic which allows the children to explore their village and surrounding areas. We will get to go 'out and about' regularly, looking at the different places within our community, including our houses! We will then use our knowledge of the local area to create maps. Our youngest children will have the opportunity to make their houses from recyclable materials before using lines and shapes to sketch who lives in their family. Our KS1 children will be exploring windmills and their uses, before designing and making their very own windmill! We will then be going on a school visit to Bircham Windmill where we will get to see a windmill in action, whilst also getting the opportunity to bake bread!

Your child will come home today with a reading book and their reading record. For those children in Reception, your child will have a wordless book. Please take time to look at this book with them, encouraging them to use the pictures to retell a story. It is vital that you hear your child read at least five times a week. Reading records will be checked regularly to ensure that reading is taking place at home.

If you have a child in Reception, please ensure that you have downloaded and connected to Tapestry so that you can see your child's learning.

Whilst we will no longer be continuing with the 'Parent Stay & Read' sessions on a Tuesday morning, we will be inviting families in for lots of wonderful events, so please keep up-to-date with Class Dojo for key information!
