## Enjoy your half term holiday



#### **Foxes**

The first half term of the academic year has now ended and what a fabulous time it has been. The children have made a wealth of progress and it has been great to see them engaging with their learning, enjoying the learning theme of 'Local Studies'. We will continue this learning theme next half term, exploring our local area further, focusing on the History of Walsingham.



All children have now completed the first Little Wandle unit and it has been great to see our youngest children practising their learning in provision. Children have nearly learnt all of their single sounds, and will be moving onto digraphs (two letters that make one sound) next half term.

In English, the children loved reading The Little Red Hen. They had the opportunity to write instructions based on making bread, retell the story and create WANTED posters for a pesky wolf that tries to eat Little Red Hen. Our first focus text next half term will be 'Katie's Sunflowers', linking nicely to our Art & Design lessons where we will learn about Van Gogh's famous painting.

In Mathematics, the children are moving on nicely through the White Rose Maths units. Our EYFS children have been focusing on the composition of the numbers 4 and 5 and they are developing their confidence with counting and recording. Our KS1 children have finished the unit of Addition & Subtraction Within 20 and are now moving onto Place Value Within 100. They are exploring larger numbers, thinking about tens and ones.

Our EYFS children have enjoyed studying the seaside in their Understanding of the World sessions. They have explored sea creatures, compared the current seaside to how it was in the past and even made sea creatures from clay. Our oldest children have ended their Geography unit by completing a comparison of our local area with Africa. They took time to learn about the continent and identified key physical and human geographical features.

As the half term comes to a close, I want to take this time to thank you for your engagement as parents. It has not gone unnoticed and we are extremely grateful that the children are being supported with their learning within their home environment — it really does make all the difference!
