Lots of news today...



Foxes Well here we are, the next half term of the academic year and it is full steam ahead in Foxes Class as the children continue with their learning and get prepared for all things 'Christmassy'. I always love this time of year in school as lots of events are going on and the children are excited as they take part in many celebrations. Lots of events will be noted on this newsletter, so please do add them to your calendars!



This half term we are continuing our topic of 'Local Studies'. The oldest children, will be focusing on History instead of Geography, studying Walsingham as a place of pilgrimage. The children will be learning about the Tudor Period, including Henry VIII and his six wives! Our youngest pupils will continue to explore their natural surroundings and they will take part in indoor and outdoor activities. As the weather turns, please ensure they are dressed appropriately and they have wellies in school! A few of the activities they will be completing include making Autumn Bonfire Soup, making bird feeders and as we near the end of the half term they will make gingerbread!

To begin the half term, the children focused on the text 'Katie's Sunflowers'. They had the opportunity to study sunflower seeds using adjectives to describe their appearance and texture. After this, they planted the seeds and wrote instruction texts on how to plant and care for sunflowers. To finish their learning, KS1 focused on the artist Vincent Van Gogh and wrote biographies, whilst EYFS made leaflets labelled 'How to Grow a Sunflower'. We will now move onto a new text. KS1 will focus on the book 'A House Held Up by Trees', whilst EYFS will look at the very well-known traditional tale called 'The Three Little Pigs'.

In Mathematics, our EYFS children are up to speed! They have completed their learning for the Autumn Term, learning all of the new focus concepts. They will now spend the next half term recapping, consolidating and embedding their learning through play and practical activities. Our KS1 children are continuing with Place Value within 100 and are tackling larger numbers, getting to grips with tens, ones and being able to flexibly partition numbers!

Our afternoons are busy as always. In Art, the KS1 children are focusing on self-portraits and portraits. They are learning how to use line effectively in order to create a self-portrait with increasing accuracy. Our EYFS children are focusing on different painting techniques, learning how to print, mix and merge different colours to create scenes and pictures.
